## Relationships and Sex Education (RSE)

As a part of your child's educational experience at Stamford Bridge Primary School, we aim to promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive programme of Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) and Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) that gives children and young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live healthy, safe, productive and fulfilled lives, both now and in the future.

Across the Spring term, in PSHE, children in **Years 5 and 6** will be taught lessons with a focus on body changes and puberty. Sessions on puberty and changes to the body are statutory and form a part of the UKS2 Science Curriculum – this means that you are unable to withdraw your child from puberty and changes to the body sessions.

Within the first half term (date to be confirmed), **Year 6** children will be visited by the East Riding School Nurse who will deliver a session on: boys and girls' changes, how babies are made and how to look after yourself. This session is non-statutory, and you do have a right to withdraw your child from this. When the East Riding School Nurse comes into school, they will deliver additional resources to those from 1 decision (linked below). If you require further information or with to see these, please get in touch with Miss Greening.

If you do wish to withdraw your child from the how babies are made session, please inform Miss Massey as soon as possible. We will remove your child from this non-statutory session only. If we do not hear from you, we will assume that it is okay for your child to take part.
